2. Describe how this evaluation report was prepared and how it was submitted to the governing body, released to the media, and made available to the public:

This evaluation report was prepared by the City's CRS Coordinator after an evaluation of pertinent projects that have been completed, are currently underway, or are being considered for implementation.

The report will be submitted to the City Commission in July 2020 via memorandum from the City Manager. The report will be posted on the City's website so that the public and the media can access it.

3. *Provide a description of the implementation of each recommendation or action item in the action plan, including a statement on how the project was implemented or not implemented during the previous year:*

As part of the City's plan, we had undertaken a drainage improvement project to increase the size of a detention pond that is part of the Royal Palm Estates community (Broward County Surface Water Management License No.: SWM1990-102-0/ERP Application No. 181231-60). The project was intended to reduce the storm drainage stage elevation for the 100-year 3-day event for that specific residential community.

4. *Discuss why any objectives were not reached or why implementation is behind schedule:*

The City of Margate has submitted an application, including revised drainage calculations and stage-storage calculations, to Broward County Surface Water Management Division to amend/supersede the existing SWM License. If approved, all objectives will be met and all of the licensing requirements will be satisfied without the need for execution of any physical modifications to the drainage system.

5. *What are the recommendations for new projects or revised recommendations?*

No new projects are being considered at this time.
