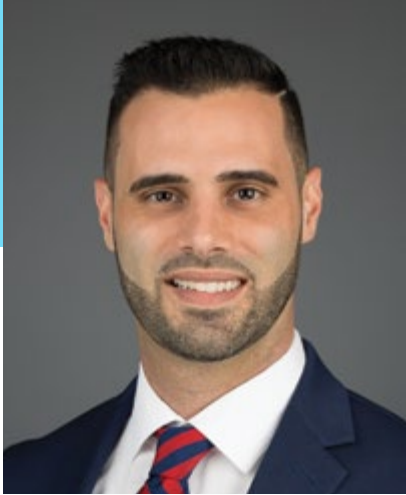

Commissioner Arserio recognized with 2023 Home Rule Hero Award

The Florida League of Cities has recognized Commissioner Antonio V. Arserio with a 2023 Home Rule Hero Award for his hard work and advocacy efforts during the 2023 Legislative Session. Commissioner Arserio worked tirelessly throughout the session to promote local voices making local choices, protect the Home Rule powers of Florida's municipalities, and advance the League's legislative agenda.

"The League and its legislative team appreciate the individual advocacy efforts undertaken by municipal officials throughout the state," said FLC Chief of Legislative Affairs Casey Cook. "Home Rule Heroes are some of our biggest advocates for protecting local decision-making. They are League members who stand out for their high level of participation, knowledge, and effectiveness. This year's Home Rule Heroes continuously advocated for their communities throughout the 2023 Legislative Session."

Home Rule is the ability of a city to address local problems with local solutions with minimal state interference. Home Rule Hero Award recipients are local government officials, both elected and nonelected, who consistently responded to the League's request to reach out to members of the Legislature and help give a local perspective on an issue.

Temporary Conversion to Free Chlorine

To maintain high water quality in the City's water distribution system, the City of Margate Water Treatment Plant will temporarily change its treatment process to increase free chlorine disinfection from August 1 through August 21, 2023. This proactive measure prevents bacterial growth in the water mains and keeps the water safe for potable use. Pay the Water Bill at Walmart MoneyCenter

You can now pay your Margate water bill at Walmart MoneyCenter for your convenience. To complete your payment in person, you'll need your account number, the amount, and either cash, a debit card, or your UnitedHealthcare Ucard. Payments will be electronically transmitted to the City through CheckFreePay; expect the payment to reflect in your water account within 2-3 business days. Credit cards are not accepted as a form of payment at Walmart MoneyCenter. A processing fee of \$1.50 will be charged.

SHINE

(Serving Health Insurance Needs of Elder) counselor to assist with Medicare and health insurance questions.

EHEAP

(Emergency Home Energy Assistance) is a program that provides assistance for home-energy emergencies to qualified, low-income households with at least one person 60 years of age or older.

Broward County Property Appraiser: At the Center the first Monday of the month, 10 a.m. – 12 p.m. Margate residents can apply for Homestead Exemption and other tax-saving property exemptions. You can make an appointment for the Exemption Express service at web.bcpa.net or by calling 954-357-5579.

Adult Daycare: Provides care and companionship for older adults who need assistance or supervision during the day. The program offers relief to family members and caregivers, allowing them to go to work, handle personal business, or relax while knowing their relative is well cared for and safe.

Dos and Don'ts of Parking

- Vehicles cannot park over the sidewalk.
- Vehicles must park facing the correct flow of traffic.
- Per posted signs, vehicles cannot park in "No Parking" zones.
- Vehicles cannot park in the swale (grass area between sidewalk and street) where a curb is provided.
- When no curb exists along the street, vehicles must park with no more than 12 inches of vehicle protruding into the roadway.
- When a curb exists along the street, the right-hand wheels of the vehicle must park within 12 inches of the curb.
- All vehicles must have valid tags. Vehicles without proper tags are considered "improperly stored."
- Improperly stored vehicles parked on public property will be towed.
- All vehicles must be operable and able to drive.
- Inoperable vehicles parked on public property will be towed.
- Commercial vehicles cannot park on public property.
- Commercial vehicles are only permitted to park on commercial property when they are an accessory to a business on the property.
- Permitted commercial vehicles must park according to Sec. 26-3 of the City Code.
- Recreational vehicles/boats/trailers cannot park on public property.
- Recreational vehicles/boats/trailers must park according to Sec. 26-2 of the City Code.

No Tractor Trailer Parking

Tractor trailers are prohibited from parking in any residential area and public property in the City of Margate. There are no exceptions.

There are only two instances where a tractor-trailer is permitted to park in this city:

- When the tractor-trailer is a bona fide accessory to a business on the same property;
- When the tractor-trailer is parked at a storage facility approved by the City of Margate to store commercial vehicles.

Tractor trailers parked illegally on public property will be issued a parking ticket by the Police Department for each vehicle portion (tractor and trailer). Each ticket carries a \$150 fine and can be given every 24 hours that the violation occurs.

Tractor trailers parked illegally on private property will be issued a Notice of Hearing by Code Compliance to the property owner. The violation will be presented to the Special Magistrate, which can result in a fine to the property owner of \$5,000 per day for every day the violation occurs. A lien may be placed on the property.

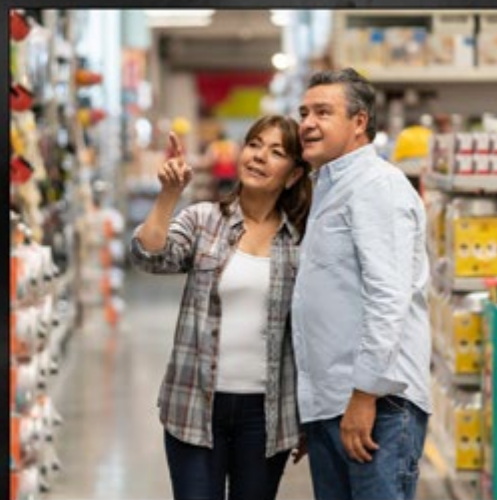

2. Prepare Before Hurricane Season



Develop an evacuation plan



Assemble disaster supplies: food, water, batteries, charger, radio, cash



Get an insurance checkup and document your possessions



Create a communication plan with a hand-written list of contacts



Strengthen your home



3. Stay Protected During



Stay in your safe places from water & wind



Have a way to get weather alerts and forecast updates



Keep in mind that impacts can be felt far from the coast



Listen to local officials & avoid travel unless ordered to evacuate



4. Use Caution After Storms



If you evacuated, only return home when directed it's safe to do so



Remain vigilant, as hazards remain: heat, downed powerlines, floodwaters, & more



Clean up safely: don't push yourself, and check on neighbors



Only use generators outdoors, 20+ feet from your home



Prepare for the likelihood that help and communications may not be available
