First, it ensures that businesses operate within the legal framework established by local regulations. Secondly, compliance contributes directly to the sustainability of our Margate by providing funding for essential services such as public safety and local development projects.

If you own a business in our City that has fallen behind the required compliance, this opportunity will alleviate your financial burden. Companies that comply with the LBTR will receive a waiver of all late fees until the end of February 2024.

No Overnight Parking at Parks

We all love our City parks, but you cannot leave your vehicle parked there overnight. Please be a good neighbor and follow the posted Park Rules, which indicate their hours of operation. Parks are open from sunrise to sunset (unless otherwise posted), and it is unlawful to conduct any business or be present at any park during any hours in which the park is not open to the public. If you are parked illegally, your vehicle may be towed, or you may receive a parking violation ticket.



New Amnesty Program for Local Business Tax Receipts

Effective now until Thursday, February 29, 2024, the City of Margate is offering an Amnesty Program for unpaid or pending-in-review Local Business Tax Receipts (LBTR). This new initiative was created to ensure that all business locations are safe by meeting compliance with Building and Fire Codes.

Per Chapter 25 of the Margate Code of Ordinances, all businesses in Margate must have a valid LBTR. This process triggers various inspections and reviews to ensure the health, safety, and welfare of our residents.

If, for some reason, you opened a business and did not get an LBTR, you have this limited opportunity to bring your business into compliance and receive a waiver for all late fees – but only until February 29, 2024.

Property Improvement Grant Programs Are Accepting Applications



Margate Wins the 2023 Gold Civic Experience Award

The City of Margate earned **first place** in the 2023 Civic Experience Award for its new Property Improvement Grant Program (PIP). The Civic Experience Awards recognize local governments working hard to improve civic experiences in ways that create greater resident satisfaction and safer, cleaner, and more profitable communities.

At an online awards ceremony held on September 18, 2023, the City of Margate received a Gold Civic Experience Award trophy and a \$1,500 charitable contribution from CivicPlus.



Good news: The citywide Property Improvement Grant Program (PIP) will reopen and begin accepting online applications on Monday, January 8, 2024, at 9 a.m.



The PIP Grant provides a 50% reimbursement grant of up to \$50,000 for commercial or multi-family properties and common areas, as well as building exteriors owned by condominium or homeowner associations. The program also provides 50% reimbursement up to \$10,000 for improvements to single-family or multi-family (individually owned) homesteaded properties.

Please get your project estimate from a licensed contractor now and be ready to submit it when the application opens on January 8, 2024.

In addition to this program, if you have a residential or commercial property located within the boundaries of the Margate CRA, you are also eligible to apply for the MCRA Property Improvement Program Grant. This grant will help you restore, renovate, and improve your properties within the CRA district.

The company will employ skilled engineers and manufacturing personnel and plans to open this location in mid-2024, occupying 130,000 square feet of warehouse space in the First Gate Logistics Center at 5301 W. Copans Road.

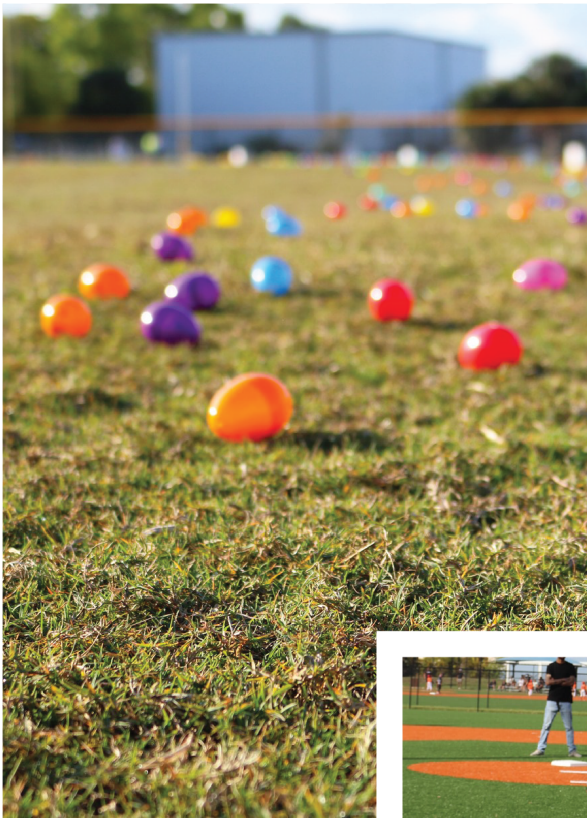

On **Valentine's Day** Spread Love - Not Flames

As you celebrate February as the month of love, we ask that you don't forget about fire safety. If you're planning an evening with candles, please remember to:

- Always keep candles in a sturdy holder on a flat, stable surface.
- Never leave candles unattended, especially if you have pets or children.
- Keep candles away from flammable materials and drafts.
- Consider using battery-operated flameless candles, which can look, smell, and feel like real candles.
- Don't use lit candles in bedrooms, bathrooms, and sleeping areas.
- Blow out candles when you leave a room or home or go to bed.
- Keep candles at least 12 inches away from anything that burns.

Springtime Fire Safety

As we enter Springtime and think about spring cleaning tasks, we ask that you don't forget about fire safety. Please follow these safety tips:

- Remove unnecessary items that could fuel a fire, like old newspapers, cardboard boxes, or excess clutter.
- Clean the oven, stovetop, and microwave to prevent grease buildup. Ensure there are no flammable items near the stove.
- Safely discard expired or damaged cleaning chemicals.

In March, as we spring forward an hour for Daylight Saving Time, we ask that you remember to:

- Check your smoke alarms and carbon monoxide detectors for functionality.
- Replace batteries in alarms that require them.
- Ensure alarms are installed in suitable locations throughout your home.

When spring arrives, many of us look forward to outdoor grilling. Keep grilling safely by:

- Placing your grill away from structures, overhanging branches, and other flammable materials.
- Regularly cleaning your grill to prevent grease buildup.
- Never leaving a lit grill unattended.

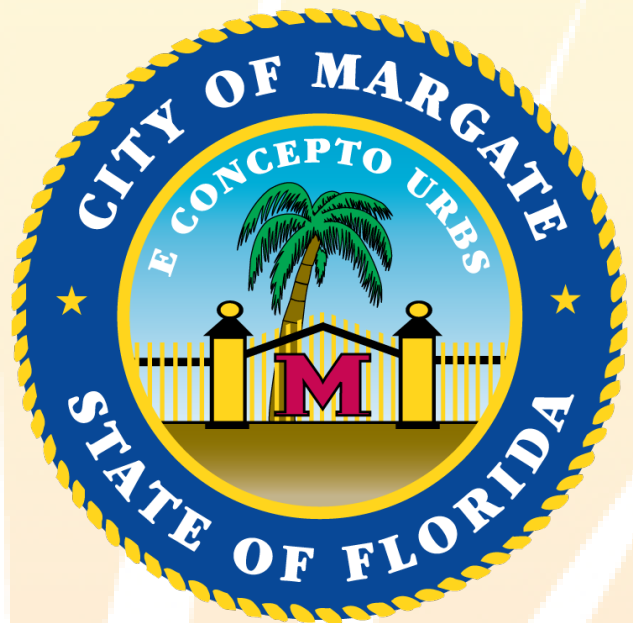
